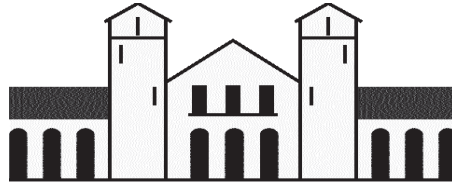

Reminder - Snow removal

Now that snow is here, please remember that **snow must be removed** from sidewalks within 4 hours after a storm for businesses or 24 hours after a storm for residence.

Graffiti - more vigilance is needed – call 311!

From our neighbor, Kim:

"You may have noticed that we are experiencing a fair amount of graffiti in our neighborhood. I see more and more graffiti on the dumpsters these days. After monitoring the dumpsters and noticing that the closest neighbors are taking no action I've now contacted 311 on three separate occasions. While the city had cleaned several dumpsters recently more graffiti has shown up elsewhere in the neighborhood. Today I submitted a request for five separate alleys plus the billboard at Colfax between Monroe and Garfield.

I think not taking actions signals that this is OK in our neighborhood. It's not OK. A quick call to 311 will get the issue cleared up rather quickly."

Recycling reminder

SCPNA want to remind everyone to recycle whenever possible. Many residents report seeing recyclable materials like cardboard in the dumpsters – please recycle using the purple containers. Let's make SCP as green as possible.
